- Landscape Committee The landscape committee submitted the following report as a result of their walk thru:
 - ✓ With the recent cold snap, some of the grass went dormant (yellow in color).

APRIL 2018

- ✓ The bare spots in the lawn will be seeded.
- ✓ The weeds in the grass will be sprayed. (Las Flores will send Cardinal an official notice of the spraying in advance).
- ✓ Planting of the perimeter planters by the walls throughout the community will start in a week or two.
- ✓ Mulching will commence in late April.
- ✓ Tree trimming will commence at the end of May.
- ✓ Pops of color will be planted in May.

SECTION 4 OLD BUSINESS

Window Trim Color – The existing GEMA Architectural Guidelines & Standards requires almond window trim. The lone exception are gray homes which can have white window trim. Woodbridge Village Architectural Guidelines & Standards allows for white window trim. The GEMA Architectural Guidelines & Standards will be updated to allow for white window trim, in addition to the existing almond window trim.

SECTION 5 NEW BUSINESS

- <u>CVC Enforcement</u> The CVC (California Vehicle Code) enforcement signs are out of date. Some of the speed limit signs are also faded such that the signs can no longer be read. Samples of the updated signs were reviewed and the Board approved a "like for like" replacement policy.
