TURF

Mowing – Height will remain the same for the rest of the season.

Fertilization – No application scheduled for July.

Herbicide – Spot spraying for nutsedge will continue in July.



SHRUBS

Focus Pruning – Heavy pruning will be avoided to prevent sun damage.

Plant Replacement – Replacements will be done per work order or special request.



TREES

Scheduled Trimming – Palm pruning will continue through July.

JULY 2019 HIGHLIGHTS

July is the hottest month of the year. Temperatures range between 105 and 120 degrees. These temperatures are hard on employees, plants and turf. Everyone and everything are in survival mode.

Irrigation is critical and must be monitored daily. Expect usage to be at the highest levels of the year.

Pruning will be limited and should be avoided on sun sensitive plants.

New plantings should be postponed if possible until the weather cools in September.

Washingtonia palms that were not pruned in June will be pruned this month.

Turf should now be at lower heights and have transitioned to predominantly Bermuda. Bermuda does not grow well in the shade. Expect poor quality turf in shady areas.

Weeds will need to be sprayed regularly to be kept under control.

Monitor annual flower beds for weeds and pests and treat as necessary.
