TURF

Mowing – Mowing height will be at 1.5” and will remain at the height for the winter.

Fertilization – The first fertilization to turf will be completed after the first mowing.

Herbicide – No herbicide applications are scheduled for December. Planter areas will be treated with Glyphosate as needed.



SHRUBS

Focus Pruning – Maintenance pruning will continue as needed. Structure of shrubs will be kept looking natural without balling or squaring the shape.

Plant Replacement – Plant replacements will occur based on approved service order requests.

TREES

Scheduled Trimming – Tree pruning will be completed in December.



DECEMBER 2017 HIGHLIGHTS

December brings an end to the fall transition in the desert. The winter landscape is established and plant growth slows significantly.

Irrigation continues to be reduced and days may be skipped as the weather continues to cool.

Frost is a possibility for the next couple of months. Cold tender plants may be damaged. These include bougainvillea, hibiscus, Carissa, and lantana. Newly planted plants are more susceptible. Heavy pruning should be avoided. Walking or driving across turf areas when ice is present will kill the grass.

Turf areas will need to be fertilized to maintain good color. Reseeding will be necessary in turf where Bermuda has gone dormant and is now brown.
