Love Those Kids Safely

- Whenever possible, kids should ride in a back seat and always be properly secured. Crash statistics show that's the safest place to be.
- Secure infants up to about 20 pounds and about one year of age in a rear-facing infant seat.
- Secure children who are between 20 and 40 pounds and 26 to 40 inches tall (up to about 4 years old) in a forward-facing child seat.
- Use a booster seat for children who are between 40 to 60 pounds and 4 to 8 years old.
- Older children who have outgrown child restraints should wear the vehicle's safety belts.
- **NEVER** put a rear-facing infant seat in the front seat of a vehicle equipped with a passenger-side air bag.
- **NEVER** hold an infant or child on your lap, even if you're wearing a safety belt.
- **NEVER** put the shoulder part of a lap-shoulder belt behind the back or under the arm of a child or an adult.
