COMMUNITY NOTICE! COMMON AREA LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

As you have been made aware, and in effort to continuously minimize expenses, your Board of Directors have obtained the services of a new monthly landscape service provider, Medlin Landscape. You may have seen their trucks in the community or already met their field men.

As a reminder, the Association maintains the common area landscape. For efficiency, Medlin Landscape will be working through the community on a set <u>rotation schedule</u> and non-emergency items will be attended to in the order of the rotation. Please refrain from giving directives regarding the common area slopes to the field men and direct all questions or concerns to Management via your Account Executive, Lydia McCaig. <u>Any work being performed in the common area has been pre-approved by the Board of Directors and the Landscape Committee.</u> In addition, shrubs that are currently in bloom are beautiful, but they will be trimmed at the end of their bloom cycle to reduce the hazard of blind corners.

TIPS FOR SPRING CHANGE

Spring is finally here! That means more outdoor activities, fresh air, spring cleaning, and a time for change. Consider the tips below if you are planning to make a change this season:

- Use a shredder to discard documents that contain personal information to prevent identity theft.
- **Before disposing of items such as empty TV or gaming system boxes,** break the boxes down and conceal them in opaque garbage bags. Visible big-ticket item boxes tell thieves that there are valuables in your home that are ready for the taking.
- Close your garage door. Close your garage door when not in use so a potential burglar does not spot vehicles, tools, or other mechanical items.
- Consider upgrading your entry system to a program for use on our smart phone or tablet and check-in for security while you're away.
- **Befriend your neighbor** and know who is and isn't a part of your community. Report suspicious activity immediately to the local authorities.
- **Dust/clean your rooms from top to bottom.** Start with the highest surface first and work your way down. Vacuum or mop last.
- **Power down electronics to give them a rest.** Consider installing lamps, appliances, or computers into a power cord and shutting off the main switch to save electricity.
